## What is a Citizens' Academy?

The purpose of the Citizens' Academy is to develop positive relationships between law enforcement and the community through education.

- ✓ Not be the subject of any pending criminal investigation or criminal court case.
- ✓ Not be the respondent of any active No Contact Order or Civil Protection Order.

The sponsoring law enforcement agencies seek to fill the Citizens' Academy session with a cross section of the community.

You will be notified if you are selected to participate in the next academy.
