### Kootenai County Sheriff's Office Announces Release of Inaugural Recruitment Video

Sheriff Wolfinger is pleased to announce the release of a new recruitment tool for the Kootenai County Sheriff's Office. On January 3, 2018, a recruitment video, created by Laeng Production, was revealed to a select group of KCSO members who were in the video, or who are currently on the Recruitment Team.

The focus of the video is to educate potential candidates about our agency and to give them a short glimpse into what it means to work for the Kootenai County Sheriff's Office. The video will be posted on our agency website, and on social media with the hopes it attracts excellent candidates who will apply to work at our organization. Currently, KCSO has various positions open. Because the Jail is being expanded, many new positions are being added to accommodate a larger facility. We routinely hire Detention Deputies and Patrol Deputies, and various civilian positions like 911 Dispatchers and Jail Booking Clerks. We are also currently recruiting for Seasonal Marine Deputies who will work on the lakes and rivers in our county during the summer months. Testing for this position takes place on January 13, 2018.
